


Lynn Brunell

What a promise. Actually, promises. Fifty kids all about the fascinating world of bees, activities, and illustrations engage the reader for a deeper understanding of bee life and behavior. Following a few simple steps including cutting, gluing, and taping it together, readers can transform a cardboard box into a living home for backyard bees. Fourth grade, *Turn This Book Into a Beehive* lets kids make a cardboard beehive building a home where bees can thrive. In reversing the alarming trend of declining bee populations, *Turn This Book Into a Beehive* introduces the mason bee, a non-aggressive, non-stinging bee that does the work of over 100 honeybees. Unlike honeybees, hollow reeds or holes in wood, but here's the key for them: Tear out the perforated paper from each different room in a house--roll the sheets of paper into tubes using the book's cover, and hang them where bees will arrive, pack mud into the tubes, and plant the plants in your backyard.

Twenty experiments and activities reveal how to smell like a bee, understand their communication, learn how bees communicate with each other, and much more. It's the real buzz on bees, delivered in an interactive way.
